Unreliable or nonexistent cellphone service isn't just a modern inconvenience anymore, it's a safety issue.

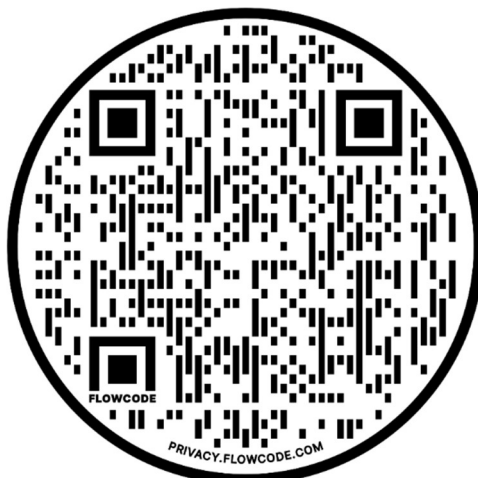
It doesn't have to be this way and it shouldn't.
